Southern Ocean (K-2)

<u>Kindergarten</u>

The students had a wonderful time with Crazy Hair Day! The creations were amazing!!

Winter has well and truly hit! We have had some chilly mornings and thick frosts already in our first week of winter. I make sure that I am wearing a singlet every day to keep nice and warm.

In Maths, we have been looking at 'Multiplication and Division'. We have been doing this by sharing objects equally. The students make sure that each group has an even amount of objects. We do this by counting them out one at a time and then checking that each group has the same amount.

If I had a 6 apples and 3 people... How many apples would each person get if I shared the apples equally?

We read 'The Monsters' Party' last week. Kindergarten had a lot of fun designing and making their own monster. We wrote about the special powers that our Monsters had! What power would your Monster have? In Southern Ocean we looked at Kadinsky's Concentric Circles for Art. The students listened to classical music as they worked and we created our own interpretation of his concentric circles. Did you know that Kadinsky could see colour when listening to music?

We had so much fun with our Crazy Hair. Thank you to all the parents / grandparents / relatives and friends who helped to produce some truly amazing hairdos for this special day. The enthusiasm shown by the children was heart-warming to say the least! We have continued to learn about bees. On Monday, we watched an informative video so we could learn about harvesting honey from a bee box. The children can tell you what tools are used, why the safety gear is worn, why certain frames are chosen and not others, how the honey is removed from the frame and how all the excess beeswax is separated from the actual honey. We then followed a guided drawing lesson to draw our own honey bee. These look brilliant! All individual and all recognisable as a bee. In Numeracy last week we concentrated on the multiplication skill of grouping and this week, on working out the volume of objects. We are practising our catching skills and

learning how to bounce pass a ball to our

partner. We have also been learning some dances to warm ourselves up on these cold days. We can all do the Heel-Toe Polka, which is a progressive Bush Dance! We have also mastered the Chicken Dance and the Hockey Pokey so we are ready for any upcoming school discos! Now we are learning some songs to sing together. We are trying to master Kookaburra Sits in the Old Gum Tree as a round, at the moment. The Southern Ocean is a very productive and fun place to be!

Nutrition Snippet

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... to make rainbow sushi.

Ingredients (serves 4)

- 1 1/2 cups sushi rice
- 4 tbsp sushi vinegar
- 185g can of tuna, drained 1 tbsp mayonnaise
- 4 nori sheets (dried seaweed) Veg cut into thin strips
- 1/2 carrot, 1/4 capsicum, 1/2 raw, peeled beetroot, 5cm cucumber, 1/2 avocado



Method

Cook rice according to packet instructions. Fluff the rice with a fork and pour over the sushi vinegar. Stir well to combine. Spread the rice on a baking tray to cool. Mix the tuna and mayo together.

Lay a nori sheet on a bamboo sushi mat, shiny side down. With wet fingers, spread 1/4 of the rice over 3/4 of the sheet, leaving a 1/4 of the sheet clear at the end furthest away from you. Place the tuna and veg across the rice. Using the bamboo mat, roll the sushi away from you stopping where the rice ends. Brush some water along the rice free nori and finish rolling, pressing gently to seal. Repeat with the rest of the sheets. Dip a sharp knife in water and cut the sushi into pieces.
